In 2004, Sideshow's affiliations with the publisher IDW; and internationally acclaimed artists Sebastian Krüger and Drew Struzan continue a tradition of collaborative initiatives by the company.

On May 2, 2005, Sideshow Collectibles began shipping its black "Collect for Life" bracelets with all retail packages that are sent out from the company's Westlake Village, California warehouse. The Sideshow Collectibles bracelets have been modeled after the incredibly popular "Livestrong" bracelets manufactured by Nike in support of champion cyclist Lance Armstrong's cancer foundation. To date, more than 40 million yellow "Livestrong" bracelets have entered the marketplace, creating a phenomenon unlike any previous fundraising initiatives.

"Like many other organizations, we have witnessed the popularity of Lance's bracelets and appreciate the symbol of strength and hope that they represent," explains Sideshow Collectibles president, Greg Anzalone. "We decided to not simply marvel at the success of the "Livestrong" program but to support it," Anzalone went on to say.

As a cancer survivor, Lance Armstrong created a foundation dedicated to supporting others who are battling the disease. That foundation has grown into becoming a strong voice in educating and supporting those with cancer. Sideshow Collectibles is now a contributor to the Lance Armstrong Foundation (www.laf.org) through every retail sale that the company makes.

Working closely with the not-for-profit consultancy "Cause You Care," Sideshow Collectibles instituted a program in which a portion of all credit card transaction fees are now donated to Lance's Foundation. With each retail purchase on the Sideshow Collectibles website (SideshowCollectibles.com), the company is donating money to a worthy cause, and direct purchasers of Sideshow Collectibles product will be rewarded for their support by receiving a "Collect for Life" bracelet, absolutely free of charge.

"Our business is first and foremost a people business," explains Anzalone. "While many know of Sideshow Collectibles only through the products that the company offers, there are dozens of incredibly talented and passionate people who work behind the scenes. Some of those people have dealt with the effects of cancer in their immediate family, with relatives and with friends. We wanted to do something to show them our support."

The "Collect for Life" program has also become a personal issue at Sideshow Collectibles. "My mom is a two-time survivor of cancer, a very courageous woman and an inspiration for me. And at present the entire company is rallying around one of our staff members who is waging a valiant battle against this disease," explains Anzalone. "I've been inspired by their courage, as well as the model of perseverance that Lance Armstrong himself represents. We're proud to be a contributor to Lance's organization, and we're pleased to share our bracelets, a symbol of our appreciation, with those customers who have decided to 'Collect for Life."

"Our company has been especially fortunate to be the recipient of so much collector support. Our products and artists have been embraced by the global collector community and we're excited to be able to share our good fortune with those that are in need of support," Anzalone explained.

THE FIRST 10 YEARS

en years can take you from college to parenthood, from a cramped living space with nothing to a larger space with nothing but collectibles. In ten years we might pick careers, fall in love, marry, have kids, divorce, make money, lose money, move, move again, see some of the world, and hopefully create or collect some art. It is such a significant time that we call it a decade and the last decade has certainly been notable.

Sideshow Collectibles is celebrating its tenth anniversary, no small feat in the figure collectibles industry. The company has significantly expanded from a garage operation, moved its offices three times and evolved from its focus on a single license (Universal Classic Monsters) to today producing 150+ different figure collectibles per year for nearly two dozen different licensed properties. In the process, it's been a wild ten years.

Now called Sideshow Collectibles, the company originally was known as Sideshow Productions, and a decade ago was an entirely different organization. The business began as a sculpting studio creating prototypes typically referred to as maguettes for the special effects industry, as well as props and set miniatures for Hollywood movies.

An additional source of revenue for Sideshow was the creation of action figure toy prototypes for industry giant Mattel and a host of other smaller toy companies. But with little personal and professional satisfaction coming from being a service company, the founders of Sideshow made the leap of faith that it too, could be a manufacturer.

The market for more sophisticated, better-crafted figures of the most notable characters in our popular culture was growing, creating an opportunity that the founders of Sideshow recognized and were eager to satisfy. Sideshow had the right mix of personnel in place with the necessary experience to make the jump from service company to legitimate manufacturer. The founding group of the company - three of which are still the driving force behind it - had expertise in sculpting, toy design, graphic design and business, and as such, the foundation was in place for the business' change of focus. The founding group was eager to accept the challenges that face emerging companies, but it would not be a smooth transition at first.

Like most business start-ups, Sideshow had its share of false starts, production issues, lost shipments and the difficult task of breaking into the mass market. With some support, persistence and good luck

Sideshow eventually became a collectible figure supplier to Target, Wal-Mart, KB Toys and Toys R Us. It was a breakthrough for the upstart and a great chance to expose their brand, Sideshow Toy.

Sideshow announced itself as a figure collectibles company when it released the Universal Studios Classic Monster 8-inch action figure line, first brought to the marketplace by Target stores in January 1998. The action figure line was well received both critically and commercially and Sideshow began to catch a vision of what it could become.

In 1999, the Boris Karloff as Frankenstein monster figure won the Collector's Choice award for "Best Action Figure," of the year and Sideshow was off and running, pulling down other awards and popularizing its brand. Just like the original monster movies from Universal Studios, success spawned sequels and new creative inspiration.

The first series of classic monsters quickly grew into a second series with new characters such as The Creature from the Black Lagoon and the Bride of Frankenstein. More success brought a third series that followed the pattern of the classic movies with Son of Frankenstein. while a fourth and fifth line followed suit. Then, entirely new product lines were













developed including three and a half inch figures (branded as Little Big Heads), plush items, shot glasses and bobble heads. But the destiny of the company would ultimately make a significant shift from the mass to the specialty market.

It took three years for Sideshow Productions to become Sideshow Toy and three years for Sideshow Toy to become Sideshow Collectibles, the company reinventing itself as it updated its vision. But it was in between the "Toy" and the "Collectibles" branding that the founders of Sideshow Collectibles realized that they would better serve the company's future by no longer selling in the mass market. The product was shifted to and now appropriately placed in specialty retailers, as well as being sold direct via the company's early catalog and eventually on its fledgling Web site.

The Sideshow Collectibles team wanted to exploit their figure expertise in a larger format and the 12-inch size seemed the most appropriate. The Universal Studios Classic Monsters were an obvious first choice but there would also quickly follow a broad range of licensed properties that spanned classic television shows, Hogan's Heroes, Get Smart, Twilight Zone, and Outer Limits; to Vietnam era military figures, Platoon; to cult film classics Monty Python and the Holy Grail,

Spinal Tap, and Army of Darkness; to the ultimate super agent "James Bond;" to contemporary television shows, Buffy the Vampire Slayer, and X-Files; and to contemporary horror, "Freddy," "Jason" and "Leatherface." Of course, the creative list goes on, most notably with historically accurate figures based on personalities from the American Revolutionary War. American Civil War, the old American West, and World War I.

The vision at Sideshow was for the company to also creatively collaborate, aligning itself with talented artists all over the world. No relationship better exemplified this vision than the partnership forged with Weta Workshop of New Zealand and the subsequent The Lord of the Rings products that have come from it. That collaborative vision would broaden to include product development in association with Stan Winston Studios, the special effects company Spectral Motion, Morpheus Gallery – the leading representative of art of the surreal - and IDW Publishers.

Even now, as Sideshow Collectibles makes a wish and blows out its ten birthday candles, the company continues to evolve. Collaborating with renowned artists like Sebastian Krüger, Alan Lee, John Howe, Drew Struzan and Mike Mignola, Sideshow has added a line of finely printed and framed collectible art to its offerings all under the relatively new Sideshow Collectibles Fine Art banner.

Sideshow Collectibles has always been keen to maintain a great relationship with fans and collectors of their products. The company has as much passion about the collectors themselves as those collectors have for the products that Sideshow sells. The company considers this an anniversary not just for Sideshow Collectibles but for all those who have made the journey with them over the years. Such supportive followers have made it possible for the company to stock its future with such landmark licenses as Star Wars, and the largely unlimited figure collectible possibilities within the Marvel Universe. With a growing and supportive fan base, Sideshow Collectibles is eager to continue our journey forward with authentic and highly detailed versions of film, television and historic character collectibles, prop replicas, and collectible fine art that inspire everyone to "Collect for Life."

AN INTRODUCTION TO

12-INCH FIGURES

ideshow Collectibles began as a small team of artists with a passion for classic horror and all varieties of historic military, producing model kits from a garage-based studio. It was a team composed of film effects industry and mass-market toy industry veterans, collectors and fans alike. The team at Sideshow Collectibles began to notice a distinct lack of collectible merchandise for retro properties like the classic Universal Monsters, and determined to fill this hole, the team at Sideshow Collectibles developed the now classic 8-inch action figure series. The line was a success and featured many fan favorites like Frankenstein, the Wolf Man, Dracula, and the Creature from the Black Lagoon. The series received high praise for the quality of the sculpts, and the line as a whole was an instant fan favorite, but the team always felt that we could do better, capture more of the essence of these characters by moving to a larger format.

It takes a veritable village to create each 12-inch (1:6 scale) figure that Sideshow Collectibles designs. Every character has been painstakingly researched and sculpted to perfection. For historic figures like Vlad the Impaler (Live by the Sword) or George Washington (Fife and Drum), we draw as much as possible from primary sources: paintings, photos, historic accounts and whatever else we can find to ensure the most accurate representation possible. For movie and TV characters, we often rely on behind-the-scenes images and DVD screen grabs.

Our sculptors, painters and fabricators work together to ensure that the molds, paint and fabric are just right before sending the prototype off for production. Sideshow searches the globe to find the right factories that meet its quality standards, which had been previously unheard of in the industry. For film and TV properties like *Planet of the Apes* and *Highlander*, we work closely with the studios and sometimes with the actual filmmakers. As in the case of the *Hellboy* line, we collaborated with director Guillermo Del Toro and *Hellboy* comic artist Mike Mignola. Every piece of clothing and each accessory that a figure comes with is crafted for total authenticity.

One of the greatest things about collecting Sideshow Collectibles 12-inch figures is that they're not only worthy of a museum-quality display, they are also extremely playable. Anyone who has ever bought one of our figures can testify to the joy of finding out that in addition to just looking good, it also has 30 points of articulation for maximum poseability.

Sideshow Collectibles continues to seek new ways to enhance our 12-inch figure line, innovating new body types, new accessories, and pushing the limits of what can be achieved in 1:6 scale. 
Hasbro, first introduced 12-inch Star Wars figures in 1978, and reintroduced the format in 1996, producing new versions of classic characters like Luke Skywalker, Han Solo, Obi-Wan Kenobi, and Darth Vader. "Over the last 10 years, we've produced over 150 different 12-inch Star Wars figures," said Derryl DePriest, Hasbro's Director of Marketing for the Star Wars brand. "We've chosen Sideshow Collectibles to carry the torch because they have an unparalleled reputation for producing quality limited edition 12-inch figures."

"Each 12-inch Star Wars figure is loaded with accessories and incredible detail, with features like opening Jedi belt pouches and accessories that fit inside," says Tom Gilliland, Creative Director at Sideshow Collectibles. "We have ambitious plans for the 12-inch Star Wars line, with a bigger range of characters than has ever been offered. Fans of the previous Hasbro 12-inch figures will be excited by our character choices – our goal is to enhance, expand, and update the amazing collection that Hasbro has offered."

Luke Skywalker Jedi Knight Item #2104......\$50. Fans have also been invited to provide input into character selection with a poll to choose the first Expanded Universe character to be done in 12-inch form. "We're excited to move into the Expanded Universe, because there are so many memorable characters from the books and games. But the focus of our line is really on the films," Tom continues. "Each year is somewhat themed around a particular original trilogy film, starting with Return of the Jedi. There will also be a healthy number of prequel characters in the mix. The figures will be divided into five groupings, collections within the overall line."

The 12-inch Luke Skywalker Jedi Knight figure introduces the Order of the Jedi Collection, and several other famous Jedi will join Luke in 2006. The other collections include the *Lords of the Sith*. Militaries of Star Wars, Scum and Villiany, and The Legacy Collection. "We're dedicated to characters from all corners of the Galaxy, including some that will really push the limits of what can be done in the 12-inch form. It's an exciting time to be a Star Wars collector."
































LIMITED EDITION WHAT DOES IT MEAN?

A syou turn the pages of this book, you'll discover a variety of articles about the process of making figure collectibles... the sculpture, the painting, and all of the other artistry involved in the creation of each Sideshow collectible. The artists at Sideshow have a challenging job: to create amazing original artworks, and to do so with the knowledge that every aspect of their artwork must be reproducible, whether it be molding and casting an intricate sculpture or reproducing an elaborate paint effect. The artists at Sideshow are always pushing the limits of what can be achieved in mass production.

You will also see the term 'Limited Edition' describing most of Sideshow's products. The term 'Limited Edition' implies that the quantity produced was purposefully limited, and that each piece is somewhat rare. For Sideshow, a 'Limited Edition' is our shorthand way of communicating the special nature of our collectibles. The intention is to never over-produce any item offered by the company; to limit the quantity of nearly every original piece that is reproduced. One of the byproducts of making our products intentionally limited is our quality control.

For Sideshow, 'Limited Edition' also means that your product is as close to a perfect reproduction of the original artwork as possible. Our quality control team will check every piece before it is shipped from the factory, to be certain that each collectible passes our stringent quality demands. If any piece were to arrive and somehow be anything less than 100% satisfying, our customer service team is standing by to resolve the problem.

'Limited Edition' also means that you won't find our products just anywhere. The SideshowCollectibles.com website offers a convenient way to order, and the weekly email newsletter will keep you up to date on new product announcements and opportunities. But if you're one of the many who enjoys 'the hunt,' searching for the latest Buffy or Star Wars collectible figure, or that elusive piece to complete your collection, Sideshow can offer a challenging hunt since most of the company's limited editions sell out quickly. When Sideshow's products have disappeared from store shelves, secondary market sources like eBay can be your best bet to track one down.

But be warned, prices can rise very suddenly on the secondary market for limited edition collectibles. Take the 12-inch Knight Who Says 'Ni!' figure from Monty Python and the Holy Grail, for instance, a figure that originally sold for \$40, but has climbed to over \$300 on eBay. The Samaritan, the lifesize reproduction of Hellboy's gun, soared from an original \$300 price to well over \$700 after the 1,000 piece edition sold out. The most extreme example of escalating value is the original Balrog statue from *The* Lord of the Rings, which originally sold for \$300. The 1,000 piece edition took months to sell out on the Sideshow Collectibles website, but once it did, prices began to rise quickly. The Balrog now sells for as much as \$3,000!




O ver the course of a career that spanned half a century, actor John Wayne went from parts as an uncredited bit player, to status as a cinematic institution. "The Duke" ultimately created characters that were symbolic of America — what Americans could and should be.

In the mythic worlds of these films, Wayne portrayed a wide variety of classic American heroes: the independent frontiersman, wandering cowboy, gunslinger, hard-bitten soldier, professional lawman, and hardworking rancher. Some of the qualities commonly associated with these characters – self-reliance, honesty, courage, determination, and personal honor - made Wayne a symbol of traditional American values. Many of Wayne's performances also contained more subtle elements. Many of his characters displayed a quiet sense of humor and a low-key tendency to idealism, generosity, and sentiment. Wayne also frequently chose roles as the imperfect hero, playing protagonists who were short-tempered, belligerent, stubborn, vain, obsessive, and possessed a surliness that ran the gamut from fairly grumpy to downright curmudgeonly. In his best performances, such qualities served to humanize his characters, allowing many movie-goers to identify with Wayne and see him not just as an idealized hero, but also as an everyman.

John Wayne was born Marion Morrison in Iowa in 1907. As a young boy, his family moved to California, where later he

attended the University of Southern California, on a football scholarship. While still at USC, he began working as a studio prop man, and in 1926, he began appearing as an extra and in minor parts. By the early 1930s, under the stage name John Wayne, he had numerous roles in "B" movies with titles such as *Range Feud* and *The Big Stampede*. It was not until 1939 that his performance as the Ringo Kid in John Ford's *Stagecoach* earned him status as a major figure in the film industry. He became a star, and by the end of his career, had appeared in more than 175 films with 142 leading roles (a motion picture record).

John Wayne is perhaps best remembered for his work in his later movies. The most engaging characters he created – roles such as Thomas Dunson in *Red River* (1948), Sergeant Stryker in the 1949 movie *Sands of Iwo Jima* (for which he received an Oscar® nomination), Captain Nathan Brittles in *She Wore a Yellow Ribbon* (1949), Ethan Edwards in *The Searchers* (1956), and Rooster Cogburn in the 1969 movie *True Grit* (for which he won the "Best Actor" Oscar®) – were men whose lives bridged changing eras, with personas shaped by their own personal histories of loss and uncertainty. His final performance, as an aging gunfighter dying of cancer in the *The Shootist* (1976), reflected aspects of the Duke's own life at that point – he passed away from cancer in 1979.

The team is composed of world-class model builders, painters, designers, fabricators, and sculptors, many of whom have served in the film effects industry. Their diverse talents and backgrounds come from all regions of the artistic globe.

This unique blend of artistic sensibility and perspective is what brings the creative spark to our products and allows for a truly fresh perspective on some long running product formats. It is never truly enough for the Sideshow 3-D team to simply make 'another' product, they are always trying to push the boundaries of any format they are working in. From articulation and accessories on 12-inch figures, to adding costuming and props to statues, to creating the Premium Format figures, Sideshow's products continue to evolve and grow. Ultimately, the 3-D team knows its artwork answers to the most important authority of all, the collector – a mission the 3-D art team undertakes with the greatest sense of responsibility.

AN INTRODUCTION TO

PREMIUM FORMAT FIGURES

The artists at Sideshow Collectibles share a common bond; although from diverse backgrounds, most have honed their artistic talents in the creation of character and figure reproductions. The Creative Services group is made up of world-class model builders, sculptors, painters, designers, fabricators and graphic artists that have served in industries such as film effects, doll fabrication, model kit manufacturing, and fashion design. Those unique talents have contributed to a well-deserved reputation for the production of high quality collectible figures.

While Sideshow was best known for its varied lines of 12-inch (1:6 scale) articulated figures, the small size poses limits to the designer's imagination, fabric choices, and the production materials. The Creative Services group has long sought a format in which they could "pull out all the stops" in creating even more detailed figure reproductions. Since many of Sideshow's 3-D team are veterans of the film effects industry, they were instinctively drawn to the scale of the large study "maquettes" used to design the greatest cinematic characters. They envisioned figures towering an astounding 18 inches tall, to give the artists unsurpassed flexibility in sculptural detail, costuming and accessories.

Sideshow Collectibles' 3-D Design and Development team, led by Tom Gilliland and Heath Hammond, partnered with longtime friend Greg Mowry of Geppetto Productions, who had established himself as a uniquely talented large-scale figure artist. They chose to tackle Karloff's Frankenstein as their first collaboration and together they crafted the Monster's carefully considered body language, a wire armature understructure for the basics of the body, and film-accurate costume complete with finely detailed "weathered" cloth. The combined talents of master sculptor, key designers, expert painters, and matchless fabricators yielded an uncompromised result and opened the door to one of Sideshow's proudest achievements. The Premium Format line represents the best of the Creative Services group's talents, combined into unique representations in 1:4 scale, made from the best selection of materials available.

Since the Frankenstein Monster's unveiling, our Premium Format 1:4 scale figure line has expanded with fan favorites such as Hellboy, Freddy and Jason, James Bond, heroes and villains from the Marvel universe, and now the legendary *Star Wars* characters have been unleashed on an eager public.

The Premium Format allows our artists to take their work well beyond normal production method limitations. The choices of fabrics are endless, and the larger canvas of the sculpture makes possible subtleties in paint schemes and intricate hair work that would be impossible in 1:6 scale.

The Premium Format figures are also in "true" 1:4 scale. We research each character and translate his or her full scale height directly into the 1:4 scale size of the final production master. For instance, the six-foot Connery Bond stands 18 inches tall, while the nearly seven-foot Jason looms well over 20 inches.

The Premium Format figures also continue to evolve. The body understructure is now solid polystone, capturing the subtlety of the exact pose of the figure as it was initially designed, and lending weight that brings added presence to each character. Some figures have rubber and wire armature arms that allow for small pose adjustments and attitude.

An important aspect of the Premium Format figures is the packaging. The graphic artists from the Creative Services group look to design a package that brings additional touches of quality, such as embossed details and metallic foil accents. They also design the inner box and materials in a way that ensures that the finely detailed figure inside will travel safely to your home.

No detail is overlooked in the design of the Premium Format figures, from a character's height and body shape, hair style, the cut of the costume, the base environment, the subtle paint work, to the final packaging. Each Premium Format figure that Sideshow produces is a testament to the artists' diverse talents in confronting and overcoming the challenges of scale figure reproductions.

Sideshow Collectibles continues to be one of the leading pioneers in small-run, limited edition, collectible figure art. We look forward to further advancements in the Premium Format line, and to sharing with you, the collector, more of your favorite iconic cinema, television, and historic characters.














SCARFACE


EMPEROR NAPOLEON BONAPARTE

At certain times and in certain places, it is possible for individuals of genius to change not only the course of their own lives, but to reshape nations and to affect the lives of millions. In the opinion of one of his most successful opponents, the Duke of Wellington, the presence of Napoleon on a battlefield was worth 40,000 men. The Emperor's soldiers were fiercely loyal to him, firmly believing in his genius and luck, and willing to fight to the death for Napoleon and for France.

POLYSTONE







hen Sideshow Collectibles considers a manufacturing medium for a new sculpture, it is hard to find one that delivers a cleaner, more substantial representation of an original sculpture than a product created in polystone. Polystone has a significant weight, a porcelain like feel to the touch, and an incredible ability to capture the most minute detail, making it unsurpassed in collectible manufacturing materials.

Sideshow Collectibles has chosen this medium time and again to bring collectible fans first class statues, busts, prop replicas, and environments from film properties such as The Lord of the Rings, Van Helsing, and Hellboy, and as a production element in its mixed-media collectible items.

Polystone is a compound made up largely of polyurethane resin mixed with powdered stone additives that give it added weight and the "stone-like" feel that resulted in the materials name itself. Polystone is durable and highly effective at maintaining a sharp paint finish and unlike porcelain, which is fired in an oven, polystone is a cold-cast material in which no heat is used in the manufacturing process, resulting in much greater variations of paint finish.

For these reasons Sideshow Collectibles has chosen Polystone as the manufacturing medium of choice. Our desire to use the material in ever more creative ways is part of the mission at Sideshow, as we push the boundaries of manufacturing with this modern art material. We look forward to your next polystone product purchase so we can share with you the quality and long lasting enjoyment that polystone consistently delivers.

CARING FOR YOUR COLLECTIBLES





ne of the most frequently asked questions we receive at Sideshow Collectibles are from collectors inquiring about the upkeep of their polystone statues. Our product team has compiled a few tips to help you ensure your polystone collectibles keep their luster for many years.

How do you remove dust without wrecking your piece? Dust attracts oils and other contaminants from the air that will eventually cause discoloring if left unchecked. You should take the time to dust your statues on a regular basis. We suggest a camera lens¹ brush (or a very soft, medium sized paintbrush) to whisk dust from the statue's delicate areas, as well as from its nooks and crannies. Follow up the dusting with a blast of compressed air which can be purchased from office supply store. IMPORTANT: Hold the can upright and not shake it while spraying - this will cause liquid to spray out, which may possibly mar your collectible.

Can I wash them or use a wet cloth? Never wash or submerge your collectible in water. You can use a damp, lint-free cloth on larger areas as well as the bases to loosen up the dust. Dampen the cloth with water but never use any harsh chemical cleaners as they can damage the paint finish and even the polystone material. Even if your collectibles are excessively dusty, the tips above should work well.

Temperature Controlled Environments: No Direct Sunlight. We suggest that collectibles be displayed in environments that have an even, consistent room temperature. As with any substance, extreme temperature changes and moisture can affect the integrity and surface quality of the polystone. If your display is near any temperature vents, we suggest that you reposition your display in another area so that the swift changes in temperature will not affect your collection.

The Tools of the Trade

What if my Collectible Breaks? Simple breaks and chips can be easily repaired by the collector at home. It will take a few supplies and a steady hand but it can be done. You will need some clear super glue (make sure it can repair plastics and ceramics), toothpicks, small soft brushes, tweezers, two part plumbers/epoxy putty, and acrylic paint.

Small chips or paint chip repairs: If you have a small chips or breaks make sure you save all the

pieces. Use the toothpicks to apply the super glue into very tight places and your tweezers to place the small pieces back strategically. You can then use the paint to touch up any surface scuffs or missing paint from the break.

Repairing broken arms or legs: Make sure both surfaces are clean from dust by brushing them with your soft brush. Then use a toothpick2 to apply the super glue to both surfaces. Wait a few seconds and then realign the broken parts. You may have to support the appendage until the glue dries depending on the weight of the broken piece. If the break was not clean and there are slight gaps in places between the two pieces, take a toothpick and work a bit of two part plumbers/epoxy putty into the crack. IMPORTANT: Make sure that you smooth the epoxy down with a dampened paint brush into the existing detail – you will not be able to sand the area once it is dry. Be careful that you use the epoxy only within the break itself as any excess will mar the undamaged area of the surface. Allow the bond to dry overnight and use your paints to retouch the small area and blend it into the existing paint color. (We do not recommend Matte Spray Finish as some of these products may damage the finish. As with any spray product you should test an inconspicuous area prior to applying to larger areas.)

Wobbly swords & leg pins: Some customers forget to inspect their item when they receive it and end up contacting us months later for a replacement, which usually is not possible so long after the product's release. But if the flaw is a slight bend in a sword, arrow, or figure's leg, these can be easily repaired by the collector. Gentley warm the bent piece or area with a hair dryer on medium heat3, which will make it slightly malleable. In this state, the material is flexible enough to allow you to straighten out a smaller part4 or to slightly reposition a leg so that it can slide onto a pin in its base.

We strongly suggest that all of our customers inspect their collectibles upon receipt. In most cases, our returns department can replace the item if it is returned to us within 30 days.

With minimal maintenance and care your Sideshow collectibles should last you a lifetime! We look forward to assisting you to "Collect for Life™."



THE COLLECTOR EXPERIENCE

opular culture has given us many pleasures – music, movies and television shows that make us laugh, cry, or scream with fright, and sometimes all three at the same time. We can go to a movie over and over or buy a TV show on DVD and watch it again and again, but a true fan wants to surround themself with reminders of their favorite characters and stories. Whether it is Luke Skywalker gazing into the twin setting suns of Tattoine, Hellboy facing off against the elder gods, Gandalf winging away from Isengard, Buffy sending her true love to Hell or James Bond battling enemy frogmen; we want to memorialize these moments by adding representations of them to our mantelpiece. They could be statues, art prints, action figures, movie posters, prop replicas or anything that evokes the source material. It is the fans' desire for these items that gave birth to the modern "collectible."

No longer are "collectibles" just your grandfather's stamp collection or eccentric Aunt Mabel's rare set of hand-painted ceramic teapots. Modern collectibles are innovative, high-quality re-creations of characters, scenes and props from beloved properties. They could be a statue of the story's hero, an art print representing the climatic battle, or a replica of one of the major weapons. And your typical collector isn't just *The Simpsons'* Comic Book Guy sitting in his mom's basement sorting his mint-in-package Star Wars toys. Modern collectors come from all walks of life, from students to grandmothers and everything in between. Even actors, directors, writers, musicians and artists have caught the collecting bug, especially for the collectibles that celebrate the seminal influences of their youth - films ranging from Universal Studios Monsters to Star Wars.

It used to be that collecting was a pretty solitary hobby. Sure your friends might have also liked *Terminator* but did they have that passion for it that drove you to obtain everything available with Arnold's face on it? Did they look at you funny

when you uttered "I'll be back" in that monotone Austrian accent?

In the not-too-distant-past, collectors had difficulty finding each other. There were only infrequent conventions to interact, trade items and share information with other fans. If you weren't near a big city where these shows occurred then you were out of luck. But that all changed with the advent of the World Wide Web.

The Internet has allowed communities of likeminded collectors to gather and share their loves, hates, suggestions and complaints. The early Internet had bulletin boards and email groups where individuals could discuss their common interests, but the percentage of people who could participate was limited by the technology. Not everyone had a Web connection or knew how to find these boards. But now that the Internet is so pervasive more people than ever are logging on to message boards. These boards, also called forums, are all over the Web and they cover every subject imaginable. Their membership can number under ten to many thousands, and people all over the world can participate. Many of these boards are devoted to collectibles, toys, statues, etc. They range from ones covering the entire collectible spectrum to those focusing on a small aspect of the industry.

Within the realm of collectibles there are many different types of forums, with most focusing solely on a particular property. If you collect all manner of action figures from "Buffy the Vampire Slayer" you may want to check out *Btvsfigs* which covers all the Buffy figures produced, from the tiny to the 12-inch. *The Lord of the Rings* fan? There are many sites and forums out there: *Lord of the Rings Guide* and *TheOneRing.net* being two of the better ones. They both have forums where collectibles are frequently debated. For those into *Star Wars* there is *Rebelscum.com* where they have a separate forum for every type

of *Star Wars* collectible. And if you only collect statues then there is no better place to visit than the *Statue Forum* which covers a wide range of manufacturers.

But for those discerning collectors who are committed to the quality, service, and licenses that can only be found from Sideshow Collectibles, then visiting Sideshow Freaks is a must. Some other collectible companies run their own message boards, but Sideshow Freaks is the only fan-run forum devoted to the product of a single company. With members from Singapore to the Netherlands and Australia to Canada, it is a place where Star Wars fans rub elbows with "Ringers," and Marvel true believers mix with Buffy aficionados. Statue buyers can debate the value of a fully sculpted statue with the action figure fan who likes to be able to pose their collectible. Interests converge as the fans of various properties and collectible formats share their own personal enthusiasms and draw others into new realms of collecting.

The forum can be a great resource too — board members help fellow collectors find new places to purchase items, trade amongst themselves and share knowledge with new fans. A really good buy from a dealer might be posted so that everyone can take advantage of it. Also if someone suspects that an online auction is too good to be true they can check the seller's references with other board members. How one displays a collection is a frequent topic, and participants post pictures of their cabinets and shelves with ideas on arrangement, lighting and safety.

But it's not just the collectors that find the boards useful. Sideshow's staff frequently lurk on these forums; it's a first hand way of finding out what the fans are thinking. A collector isn't likely to write to a company unless they have a complaint, but the message boards allow them to learn what they're doing right,

as well as hear what they're doing wrong. The fans aren't shy about sharing with fellow collectors what they think, both positive and negative. Occasionally, suggestions made on a message board might just be incorporated into Sideshow Collectibles' plans for

But ultimately the message board is by the fans and for the fans. It is a place to share in the joys and sorrows of a mutual enthusiasm. That is what the collecting community is all about. Drawn together by a shared hobby, diverse people become fast friends and end up discussing not just their favorite collectibles, but books, movies, music, and other hobbies. They travel the country to meet fellow members that they had formerly only known online. It truly does become a "community," bringing people from disparate locales and backgrounds together under a common passion.

Sadly, many of the greatest treasures Hollywood has ever produced went straight into the garbage — never to be seen again. Long before the studios recognized the priceless value of the heritage they were casually throwing away, there were certain collectors who had the foresight to salvage and preserve artifacts from the Golden Age of film and beyond for future generations to enjoy.

Among the most famous is Bob Burns, a friend of Sideshow Collectibles from the early days of the company, whose vast collection includes the Rocketman costume from the Republic Serials that inspired *Star Wars* and *Raiders of the Lost Ark*, as well as *Alien*'s facehuggers, and even the Time Machine from George Pal's 1960 film. Bob collects anything and everything from sci-fi, horror and fantasy cinema and television.

"As a monster movie crazed kid in 1948, I was lucky enough to know a movie prop builder and visited in his shop often. I was fascinated with the cane head he had fashioned for *The Wolf Man* movie staring Lon Chaney, Jr. Every time I visited, I asked to look at it. One day, the artist told me to keep it. It was the actual rubber cane head used in the film to kill Chaney when he was the Wolf Man. It was painted silver to appear as a silver metal cane head. I was so very excited to

own something from a real movie, especially one from my favorite film, *The Wolf Man*.

"That piece started a life-long quest to collect items used in films. I appreciated all that effort and imagination that went into the building of those props. I considered the pieces to be pieces of art. The tragedy at the time was that studios discarded props and all that art when the film finished shooting. I felt that was an enormous waste, a loss of history. It was then that I realized that I needed to save as much as I could of these fine pieces, especially those from the monster, fantasy and science fictions genres. I wanted to save the originals, with their battle scars, paint chips and burn marks."

Burns' museum, affectionately known as Bob's Basement, houses the equivalent of The Arc of the Covenant or the Mona Lisa, the Holy Grail of movie props; the only surviving metal armature of King Kong from the 1933 masterpiece, one of very, very few surviving King Kong props. The machined metal skeleton stands 18 inches tall and was stop-motion animated by legendary effects pioneer Willis H. O'Brien for the unforgettable scenes on Skull Island, including Kong's confrontation with the explorers on the log bridge, and his infamous battle with the T-rex.

But Burns' armature exists not because anybody was preserving history, but because it was needed for the 1934 sequel, Son of Kong. The studio stuck the priceless artifact in a box, and it was forgotten until 1975, when Burns was given the armature (still covered with rotting rubber and hair remnants). Burns removed the potentially damaging skin to preserve the "skeleton" and has kept this rarest of collector's items in top shape, on display in his basement ever since.

"I was given King Kong, the 18-inch armature used in the 1933 movie – my most historical icon, a piece revered by all stop motion animators, many of whom came to study the metal skeleton. Watching these artists made me understand the importance of saving and SHARING these marvelous historical items. Sideshow Collectibles is allowing me to share my collection by making exact replicas of the original piece. The King Kong armature will be an important addition to any collection. The replicas will spread movie history for many more to study and enjoy."


The stop-motion animation that brought King Kong to life in the 1933 classic film established a new standard for visual effects, and inspired generations of aspiring film-makers and effects technicians. 



t is a warm afternoon in Florence, Italy. A gentle breeze blows through the large open windows and into the master's studio. On the table before Michelangelo is a small sculpture just over two feet tall. It is his *macchietta*, or "maquette," a finely detailed and expertly crafted three-dimensional "sketch." A miniature sculpt he has created to prepare for a larger work he plans to do. He will present this to the Florence City Council in hopes to gain a commission for the larger, final work. Behind him looms a 19-foot block of marble ("and damaged, to boot!" he proclaims) that will eventually become the masterpiece "David." It will be three years before the figure is complete and it will take forty men five days to move it to the Pallazzo Vecchio. Archways will be torn down and the streets will have to be widened to make way. But the hammering and the chiseling have yet to begin. The final piece has yet to be released from its marble tomb. Instead he works on the sketch. The maquette. A small, yet stunning masterpiece unto itself. Arduously, the master works.

500 years later, a talented artist works in studio not unlike the master's, surrounded by all manner of astonishing creatures. An mp3 player rests on a work table alongside a sculpture, at which the artist stares intently, his head bobbing to the beat of the music. It is a maquette, a pre-production piece that will be scanned into a computer and used as a basis for the costume design of a character in a major motion picture. He will present this to the director and movie producers in hopes to gain approval for the final character design. The movie will be a

blockbuster smash and an instant cult classic. The creature will become one of the most recognizable pop icons in film history. But for now, with the sounds of an obscure band beating away through the headphones, the artist works on the sketch. The maquette. The beginning.

Today, through Sideshow Collectibles, maquettes are offered to the public as limited edition collectors items: actual copies of the originals or pieces inspired by maquettes created in the pre-production of some of our favorite movies. These works of art capture the very essence of the creative process while harkening back to the spirit of the great masterworks. 

The Queen sculpture was originally designed as a 1:4 scale maquette, a study piece to be used to create the full size Queen for the film. The 1:4 scale Queen was also the basis for a miniature rod puppet used in the film making process.


Both the goal and the challenge of creating this unique collectible was to reposition the sculpture into into a dynamic, energetic pose that would capture the true nature of the enraged Queen from the film. Due to the large size of the so-called "miniature," (nearly 3 feet tall), the designers felt that an animated bust would be the best treatment to After many attempts that included "Gigeresque" bones and other more ornate details were tried, it seemed best to display her on a strong elegant base that featured the Queen sculpture, rather than the base. With Stan's approval, the tool masters were touched up, remaining faithful to all the original sculpted details, resulting in what we feel is a beautiful, but aggressive presentation of the original Alien Queen.



"Among my influences have always been the great portrait painters of the past, and I consider myself rather traditional in that respect. I studied the works of Van Gogh, Picasso, Norman Rockwell, Francis Bacon, and then the Disney artists. That's not so odd a mix as you might at first think."





What makes the best first impression of a quality collectible product? Packaging. The Sideshow Creative Services group's Graphic Arts Department is responsible for each product's package design, as well as the marketing and trade show graphics and the Fine Art product management of items such as limited edition Gicleés. Comprised of a small in-house team of designers from diverse backgrounds, the team has raised the bar on what collectibles packaging should be. From the dramatic Demon Dog Rabbit and The Thing Maquette packages, to the classy Premium Format *Star Wars* and stark Patient Zero packages, each design is conceptualized to best represent the spirit of the respective product while truly engaging the customer.

The Life of a Box

It all starts with a concept. Conceptualizing a package design is a collaborative effort involving the Creative Director, Tom Gilliland, the two Graphic Arts Managers, Quoc Ha and Peter Mitchell, as well as staff designers, Sam Pfannkuche, John Eloe and Jennifer Gilbertson. Once the general concept, the look and feel, and the

package engineering are sketched out, the designers begin the layout process using original art, illustration, and photographic elements, all the while adhering to licensor provided style guides. Brenda Clark handles the coordinating of the numerous digital assets and elements required of a package design. The designers will also work with Sideshow's staff photographer, Ginny Guzman, to achieve the desired poses and lighting effect for the product's photography. With the layout finished, the project will undergo several rounds of internal reviews before being submitted to the licensor for review. Once all approvals have been made, the designer will create a mechanical which the printer will use to print, cut and construct the final boxes. The mechanical will also include any special features such as embosses, metallic foils or varnish effects that enhance the feel and "punch" of the overall design. With press checks and proofs from the printer, a final review of the artwork for color and placement is completed and the approval is given to bring the boxes to life. Once printed and assembled, the newly minted boxes are married to the appropriate products and act as the perfect compliment to what is a beautifully crafted collectible figure.



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
